- St. George's Church recognises that it is the responsibility of each one of its staff and volunteers to prevent the neglect, physical, sexual or emotional abuse of young people and children in our care and to report any abuse discovered or suspected to either Angela Such or Tim Boyall.
- St. George's recognises its responsibility to implement, maintain and regularly review procedures, which are designed to prevent and to be alert to such abuse.
- St. George's Church is committed to supporting, resourcing and training those who work with young people and children and to providing supervision.
- St. George's Church is committed to maintaining good links with the statutory childcare authorities.
